NYS Law requires:

1. Blood lead level tests at 12 and 24 months.
2. Lead risk questionnaire be given at every well child visit between 6 months and 6 years of age.
3. Childcare providers document blood lead level testing.

To help remind parents & providers of these required tests and how to document them, the Coalition to Prevent Lead Poisoning has developed the following chart:

Questionnaire given? (date)										
1) Does the child live in or regularly visit a house built before 1960 with peeling or chipping paint?										
2) Does the child live in or regularly visit house built before 1960 with recent, ongoing or planned renovation or remodeling?										
3) Does the child have a brother or sister, housemate or playmate being followed or treated for lead poisoning?										
4) Does the child frequently come in contact with an adult whose job or hobby involves exposure to lead? Examples: construction, welding, pottery										
5) Does the child live near an active lead smelter, battery recycling plant, or other industry likely to release lead?										
6) Does the child live near a heavily traveled highway where soil and dust may be contaminated with lead?										
Blood Lead Level Test Result										

Blood lead level tests required at 12 and 24 months. Blood levels should be drawn at other times if answer to any question is "YES."
